New agent feels suited for county

Although she is new to the job of a county Extension agent, Katie Frizzell believes she will be well suited as family and consumer sciences agent in Stone County. She has always wished for a career where she could help people, and she has also been drawn to Mountain View.

Katie and her family visited Mountain View for the first time when she was 11. Her father had taken family vacations here as a child and wanted to share the place with his own family, she said.

"I fell in love with it at a very young age. I always told my parents I'm gonna live in Mountain View. I love it here."

Originally from Star City in Lincoln County, Katie grew up on a farm where her family raised crops including soybeans and corn. Her family has been farming for generations.

"Dad always said he didn't have two daughters. He had two kids. He raised us to work hard, and my sister and I grew up working outside and getting dirty. ... We grew up to be flexible."

Katie said the many outdoor activities are part of the appeal of living in Stone County.

"I love the mountains and the trees. I love the outdoors anyway, and this is a town that's very in tune with nature, and everybody's nice."

She enjoys hunting and canoeing, she said, but also cooking, sewing and knitting, reading, and photography.

Katie's mother works as a rice agronomist at the Stuttgart Research Station, so Katie grew up knowing about the Extension Service but did not always intend to pursue a career with it. She only knew that she wanted to help people in some way.

She had taken family and consumer science classes in high school, but when she started college at Henderson State University in Arkadelphia, she initially planned to major in nursing. She also considered teaching, but when she discovered they had a major in family and consumer sciences, she realized it was a perfect fit for her.

Katie earned a bachelor of science in family and consumer sciences, with a specialization in foods and nutrition and a minor in Spanish. Family and consumer sciences are basic life skills that everyone should know, she explained, and she feels they should be emphasized more in school.

"I realized I didn't want to teach one age group. With the Extension, you're still a teacher in a way, but you get to teach people of all ages."

Katie has some ideas about how to help Stone County. She plans to work on getting senior citizens more involved in the community and having more programs for them. She will work with the

senior center and assisted living facilities to target seniors with programs on nutrition and economics, for example.

She also plans to grow the membership in Extension Get Fit classes.

She wants to work with young children on building life skills early.

"I want them to grow up knowing how to grocery shop, read a food label, cook, etc."

Although she did not have a very active 4-H program available to her as a child, Katie did a 4-H internship in Drew County last year and is enthusiastic about helping with that program.

"I definitely want to dive in with 4-H and get involved with the kids and parents," she said.

Katie's position has been empty since Rachel Chaney left in August, and Agriculture Agent Tyler Caston said he is very happy to have Katie on board.

"We're excited to have Katie. It'll be a big help."

Katie has few acquaintances in Mountain View, but expects to keep busy by getting involved in the community as much as possible.

She will also be pursuing a master's degree online from the University of Central Arkansas.

"Outside of work, I'm looking forward to getting to know people, making friends, and building roots in Mountain View, because I really would like for this to be my home."

Stone County Sheriff Lance Bonds would like to warn the community that on February 3, his office was contacted by a resident and filled a complaint about a phone scam. According to the information, the scammer claimed to be an Internal Revenue Service agent.

The scammer began telling the resident that an arrest warrant had been issued for the resident and the IRS needed personal information.

When the personal information was refused, the scammer began asking about family members. Again, no information was given and the scammer became irate and hung up. The specific scam telephone number is 844-747-0851.

The sheriff cautions everyone to be aware that once personal information is released, there is no getting it back. He said that you should never give out any information about yourself or family members. If you have concerns, hang up and contact your law enforcement agency immediately.

A public hearing will be held on Thursday, February 16, 2017, at 5:00 p.m. at the Stone County Courthouse Courtroom, 107 West Main, Mountain View, for the purpose of identifying and prioritizing the community needs of Stone County, determining whether an application for Arkansas Community and Economic Development Program (ACEDP) funds should be developed and if so, for what community need. Also, comments on proposed project activities will be discussed, especially those with possible impacts on the community, should the project receive funding.

ACEDP funds are federal assistance received by the State of Arkansas and administered by the Arkansas Economic Development Commission. These funds will be made available to cities and counties according to need and can be used for housing rehabilitation, community facilities, or economic development, but must address one of the following objectives:

1. Provide benefit to low and moderate income families,
2. Aid in the prevention of slum and blight, or
3. Meet other community needs, which pose a serious, immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community where no other funding is available to meet such needs.

All residents of Stone County are encouraged to attend the hearing and participate in the community development process. Stone County will provide technical assistance in developing proposals by groups representing low- and moderate-income persons.

I'm tired!!! I am the caregiver for my mom who has Alzheimer's Disease and she takes pretty much all of my time. Is there any way I can get some help without admitting her to a nursing home?

Wow, I commend you on keeping your mom home and caring for her. It is a full time job. The good news for you is that there are a number of resources out there to help you.

First, there are home care agencies that will come to your house and let you take a break. These agencies generally charge between \$17 and \$20 per hour. If you do a 24 hour continual care for a day or so, they will usually cut the rate. Doing this will let you get away for some time to just "be away" all the way up a weekend away where you can really relax. To help pay for this, Alzheimer's Arkansas gives grants for respite care. This money is available to anyone with a dementia diagnosis, not just Alzheimer's Disease. They can be reached at 1-800-689-6090.

Another option, is adult daycare. Here, for much less money per hour, a person can go and be cared for, fed and entertained for a day. You will have to arrange to drop them off and pick them up within certain time periods; however, for a day of peace and quiet, this is a great option.

What if you just want a "staycation" (a vacation where you stay at home)? Then, most nursing homes offer respite care. They will generally require a minimum number of days since there is a fair amount of paperwork involved; however, say for 5 days or so, you can put your loved one there, they will be well-cared for, and you can stay at home. You will have to pay the daily private pay rate but considering the prices of hotels and travel, it might just make sense to use this option. I hope this helps.

VETERANS OUTREACH

In order for Stone County to forgive personal property taxes, a veteran must produce a "Summary of Benefits" letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs each year.

The VA Benefits section must indicate that a service-connected disability exists and show a percentage of evaluation. It must also show that the veteran is totally and permanently disabled due to a service-connected disability. This is the key paragraph.

For survivors of veterans to expect tax relief, the summary of benefits letter must confirm that the person in is receipt of Dependency and Indem-

nity Compensation and that the veteran died as a result of a service-connected disability.

A veteran who has been upgraded to totally and permanently disabled but whose letter does not indicate this may contact Marsha at the Department of Veterans Affairs in Little Rock to request an updated letter. The phone number is 501-683-2382.

Stone County forgave more than \$105,000 in disabled veterans taxes last year. We are here to see that you get what you are entitled to. If you have questions, call Collector Sue Younger or myself at the veterans service office.

CONSUMER ALERT

Scammers pose as atty. general

Scammers are posing as the Attorney General's office to try and trick Arkansans into turning over personal information. The Attorney General's office recently received reports of Arkansans receiving a phone call from a Utah phone number stating that the consumer needs to contact the Attorney General's office to inquire about a legal account. This is a scam.

"These criminals know that their tactics have more credibility if they pretend to be Arkansas's chief consumer advocate," said Arkansas Attorney General Leslie Rutledge. "They think they can trick consumers into turning over personal and financial information, ultimately giving the scam artists access to personal accounts. If an Arkansan receives one of these suspicious calls, hang up

and contact the Attorney General's office at (800) 482-8982 or oag@arkansasag.gov."

Attorney General Rutledge released the following tips to help spot this scam and avoid falling victim:

- These agencies also do not seek or accept payment in pre-paid gift cards.

- If a consumer owes money, legitimate collectors must send a written validation notice.

- Do not confirm or provide personal or financial information to an unknown person over the phone or internet.

- If consumers file a complaint with the Attorney General's office, they will receive an acknowledgement letter or email that contains a complaint number. That number would never be referred to as a legal account. Keep in mind that con-

artists do not follow the law anyway, so they disregard the do-not-call registry. And technological advances allow for Call ID spoofing, so that scammers can disguise the source of the calls.

CURES ACT AUTHORIZES NEW BREED OF SMALL EMPLOYER HEALTH REIMBURSEMENT ARRANGEMENTS (HRAs)

The 21st Century Cures Act, a new law signed late in 2016 that helps fund medical research, also provides a cure for the health insurance woes of small employers. Under this legislation, your small business may now offer stand-alone Health Reimbursement Arrangements (HRAs) for employees.

An HRA is a special account used to pay health care expenses, similar to the way some employers use Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs). Unlike FSAs, however, HRAs may pay for insurance costs - including deductibles, co-insurance and co-payments - in addition to other qualified expenses. In this newly defined, small employer HRA, contributions are provided by the employer as opposed to pay withdrawals determined by the employee.

HRAs are often paired with high-deductible health insurance plans. Distributions and reimbursements from HRAs used to pay for qualified expenses are completely tax-free to employees.

Previously, the *Affordable Care Act* (ACA), which includes an insurance mandate for employers with 50 or more full-time (or full-time equivalent) employees, effectively barred stand-alone HRAs for small employers. But now the *Cures Act* permits stand-alone HRAs if the following conditions are met:

- The employer has fewer than 50 employees and doesn't offer any other group health plan to employees.
- The plan is funded solely by employer contributions.
- Typically, HRAs must offer the same basic terms for all eligible employees.
- The maximum annual employer contribution is \$4,950 per year for an HRA covering just the employee and \$10,000 that also covers family members.
- The plan must provide payment or reimbursement for qualified expenses. Documentation by employees is required.

Although the future of the *Affordable Care Act* is uncertain, it is expected that stand-alone HRAs for small employers will remain a viable option in the years to come. If interested, these new smaller employer HRAs may be offered beginning in 2017.

Watershed assistance available through NRCS

Producers and landowners of agricultural land, pastureland and non-industrial private forestland in the Greers Ferry Lake/Upper Little Red River Watershed are now eligible to apply for cost share assistance through the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP).

RCPP is a national conservation program that delivers technical and financial assistance to agricultural producers for addressing water quality concerns. RCPP is a new comprehensive and flexible program that uses partnerships to stretch and multiply conservation investments and reach conservation goals on a regional or watershed scale.

The Greers Ferry Lake Watershed RCPP will utilize EQIP funds to implement conserva-

tion practices within the Upper Little Red River watershed. Producers and landowners of agricultural land and forestland within 3,000 feet of a named and/or perennial stream in the watershed area are eligible. The four forks of the Little Red River - South Fork, Archey Fork, Middle Fork and Beech Fork in portions of Cleburne, Searcy, Stone and Van Buren counties - are targeted.

Funding will be available for conservation practices that help control sedimentation and improve habitat for fish and wildlife. These include such practices such as tree and shrub establishment, pasture planting, livestock water systems, fencing, litter shed, streambank stabilization, riparian buffers, etc. Contact your

local NRCS office for a complete list of conservation practices available and for a map of eligible land. Additionally, The Nature Conservancy will implement best management practices on a maximum of eight unpaved roads and implement two stream improvement projects to reduce sedimentation in this watershed.

An informative workshop on this program will be held on Feb. 16 at 6 p.m. at the Fox Community Center located at 16262 Hwy. 263 in Fox. The deadline for applying is March 1, 2017.

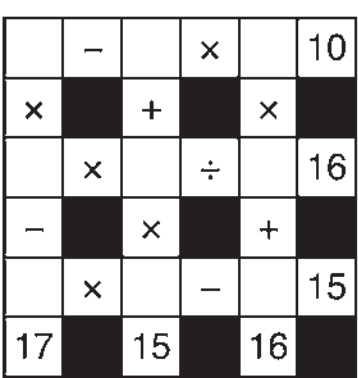
